Supported by the European Commission funded FP7 project: "unveiling creativity for innovation in Europe" (CRE8TV.EU), Manchester Business School is pleased to announce a two-day workshop for PhD students and early careers researchers.

The workshop aims at supporting attendees in:

- developing their research projects with a view to publication, especially in (innovation) journals;
- fostering knowledge exchange and networking among fellow researchers working on topics related to innovation and creativity;
- enhancing their ability to receive and deal with developmental feedback on their work along with reviewing and discussing the work of colleagues.

The majority of the time at this two day workshop will be spent discussing papers at an advanced stage of development. Each paper will be introduced by the author, and then discussed by one senior and one junior discussant.

How to Apply?

To be eligible to participate in this workshop you should be a PhD student or early career researcher (i.e., within 3 years from completion of the PhD) with a paper at an advanced stage of development. You will need to produce a complete draft of the paper (not accepted for publication) by **1st of September 2015**.

If interested in attending, please submit by **30th June 2015**, a full draft of the paper, or an extended outline (around 3 pages) to Katia Pina (katia.pina@mbs.ac.uk). The outline should include: title, author(s), affiliation, and an extended summary of the paper.

Papers can be on any topic related to innovation and innovation management, but priority will be given to papers that relate to creativity and/or the creative and cultural industries.

A limited number of places (up to 16) are available. We will inform you by 10th July if your application has been successful. Manchester Business School will cover both registration fees and accommodation costs for the selected attendees; travel costs will however be on their own behalf.

Cre8tv.eu is a multi-disciplinary, multi-partner FP7 funded research project which is studying the significance of creativity for innovation, and the wider significance of the creative and cultural industries. The scientific co-ordinator is Professor Bruce Tether, of Manchester Business School.
